NCS — National Citizens' Service

The National Citizen Service (NCS) is a once-in-a lifetime opportunity for 15 to 17 year olds. NCS takes place after exams in the summer holidays and during the autumn half term. NCS is a great chance to meet new people, develop new skills and boost your CV or UCAS application. Students take part in challenging outdoor activities, engaging with their local community and creating their own social action campaign. Each NCS place is valued at over £1,000 but, thanks to government support, NCS only ask for a £50 administration fee with financial support available, if needed. Year 12 Post-18 Options

Next half-term represents an important term for the year 12 students. Not only will they undertake crucial exams, but they will also start to plan their futures by having many contacts with different universities and employers. This will include having sessions about "Studying at university in a campus outside of London" and the "Degree Apprenticeship Programme at Queen Mary University London". Students will then visit the University of Kent to find out what a university campus is like.

As ever, our students have been pro-active in securing a wide range of summer school opportunities across the country. Students will visit top universities such as Bristol, Cambridge, UCL, Oxford, Newcastle, Queens Belfast, Surrey, Queen Mary University London, Exeter and Southampton.

Work Experience

Amoyah Morris in year 12 spent a week of her Easter Holiday working at Department of International Trade via the Civil Service work experience programme. As part of her placement, Amoyah was also filmed as part of a promotional shoot promoting the Civil Service work experience scheme to senior members of the Government. Amoyah said about the placement "It was a very insightful week. I met the Secretary for the Department of Trade and the experience gave me insight into how important the work the department do is across the world." During the summer, Amoyah has lined up a placement work in the Engineering department at Imperial College London. Her long-term plans are to study Biomedical Engineering.

Year 10 students will undertake placements at a wide range of different businesses at the end of July. This includes Honour Okroji and Eugine Amponsah at the Bank of England and a number of students working at UCL Hospital.

Visit to Clare College, Cambridge

Year 10 students visited Clare College, Cambridge to gain an insight into what is takes to study at one of the world's most renowned universities. In the morning, students toured the college alongside being given a presentation on what is expected to gain admission to a top university. In the afternoon, students spent time at the Museum of Ancient History and Archaeology, where they learnt about different figures within this period of time.

Report into Mental Health Support Offered in Year 11

Year 11 have had mental health support in PHSE. Individual lessons have dealt explicitly with coping with stress and the link between a healthy body and healthy mind. Many of the topics touched upon in PHSE do link to mental health implicitly this would include work on drugs, positive relationships and the sexual spectrum. All students across the year group have had access to this scheme of work and PHSE has been retained in the Year 11 curriculum plan despite additional exam pressures.



Pastoral systems have been streamlined over the last 18 months giving much greater clarity in the process behind reporting and recording mental health concerns and issues such as bullying. The move to the new electronic child protection system "CPOMS" has enabled an overview of student issues to be kept, giving staff the ability to see concerns in a holistic way. This means that, for example, attendance concerns can be seen in conjunction with SS involvement of CAHMs referrals. The picture this paints means resources and support can be allocated in a speedier fashion. Support for some Year 11 students has been allocated in this way. Precise recording of concerns and actions means students are not missed and information is shared promptly with all stakeholders.

Year 11 students have benefited from the support of the A–Space counsellor who has helped them work through some of those issues. From this term onwards Cardinal Pole Catholic School will take part in the CAMHs working partnership which will expand our capacity to support students across year groups once they have been identified. This puts the school in the forefront in the borough of supporting students with these needs.

In regards the stress of the new examinations, we have attempted to prepare students as thoroughly as possible, this has included time specifically set aside over Easter so they could relax. Revision plans and interventions together with revision resources have been distributed throughout the year group and confidence in dealing with stress addressed by the motivational speaker. Selected Year 11 students have SLT mentoring in which they can feedback any concerns or issues to a member of SLT.

The impact of the high stakes exam system is likely to have increasing impact over the next few years. The pressure and content have increased. We as a school has been alert to these changes and our students can approach the exams with confidence but I intend to carry out an exit questionnaire on both levels of pressure and things we could have done earlier in the year to relieve the pressure where we can.
