Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a short half term, but we have fitted a great deal in. The Year 11/12/13 have had a full programme of revision and testing and further revision continues during half term in a wide range of subjects, building on their work this year to date. For our sixth form students, this has resulted in securing offers at many top universities, including Oxford.

Catholic life continues to be a key focus. Last term, the school raised over £2,200 for our nominated charities, we look forward to achieving a similar sum as we prepare for Easter through our Lenten journey, fasting, prayer and alms-giving. All staff and students will be offered the opportunity to participate in reconciliation services upon our return. These actions will enable us to live our mission and to prepare in a meaningful way for the feast of Easter.

School attendance has improved significantly here at Cardinal Pole School, a key aspect of securing success. I am delighted to share with you that 289 students across years 7-11 have 100% attendance so far this academic year – congratulations to you all! The national average figure is 95% but we always strive to do better.

Congratulations to all our year groups who are above national average - Year 7 continues to take the lead at 96.62%.

Although there is no official national figure for punctuality, we are always aiming as close to 100% as we can reach.

336 students across year 7-11 have 100% punctuality to date – Year 8 takes the lead with 83 students with 100% punctuality. Further details are included below:-

The term may be short, but Careers and Enrichment has still been a big part of the students' curriculum. Here is a quick overview of what has happened and what will be taking place over the remainder of the academic year.

Year 13

Students who are not intending to attend university will be given support in preparation for obtaining a suitable apprenticeship. We are hopeful that some of our students will access paid internships through the Brokerage and Black Rock schemes.


Mentoring Works Programme

Into University Partnership

IntoUniversity have been working with Cardinal Pole Catholic School since 2012, and sees just under 300 students from the school every year. Our aim is to provide students with the skills and opportunities to achieve success after they leave school, and to make sure that every student has the option of going to university should they wish to. We have a high rate of success, with students up to **56% more likely to go to university** if they complete our programme. Each year, we select around 30 students per year-group to take part in our workshops, which work on **key skills** (such as working independently, and public speaking); we also run a range of **trips to universities** (such as Oxford, City, and King's College) and our **corporate partners** (such as BlackRock, MetroBank, and Airbnb). If you are interested in your child benefitting from the **Into**University programme, please speak to Mr. Egan, Career Guidance Manager at the school: our programme is not only delivered in school! Even if your child is not in our cohort for their year-group, they can attend our **Academic Support** sessions after school at our centres (in Haggerston, Clapton Pond and Bow); here, they can receive **help with school work, advice about subject-choices, mentoring, and holiday programmes**.
