



Khalid likes football, hip hop, computer games and has a big crush on a girl — like any other teenage boy. Except being a young Muslim in the aftermath of 9/11 can be very dangerous. Snatched in the middle of the night he is thrown into a nightmare world in which he is presumed guilty. Alone, afraid and far from home, will he have the strength to survive? *Guantanamo Boy* asked difficult questions about how we balance human rights and national security — and what happens if we get the balance wrong.
