WELCOME BACK

During the summer we had a variety of events taking place at school, very successful summer schools for our new Year 7s and selected Year 8s as well as the Oscar Murrillo's (ex-student) Art Exhibition which received great reviews!

I am also writing to update you on the summer's results and a safe return to school. As you will be aware, the results this year were as a result of Centre Assessment Grades (CAGs). The outcomes for both GCSE and A Level were outstanding and we are very proud of our students who worked tirelessly to achieve their goals. Details are as follows:-

Progress 8 score : 0.9

Proportion of students securing 9-4 in English and Maths: 78%

Percentage 9-4 Maths: 84%

Percentage 9-4 Best English: 81%

Percentage securing 9-4 in two Sciences: 79%

We are very proud of them all. Students who were especially successful at GCSE included:

These grades were in addition to a whole range of other outstanding grades.

At A Level, the school continues to secure exceptional progress and were again secured an ALPS1, or an Outstanding grade, equating to top 1% nationally. This has been a year of significant challenges for both students and staff, managing both the challenges of COVID and embedding post 16 changes and all are to be congratulated for the hard work and resilience needed to secure these results.
