### SUMMER ASSESSMENT WEEK: 24<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2024 (Year 10)

From Monday 24<sup>th</sup> June, all students will be following a bespoke timetable for their Summer Assessments (AP2). The school day will start at the usual time of 8.35am with students expected to arrive at 8.30am. Rather than attending lessons, the day is then divided into three 1.5-hour slots during which students will complete exams in the exam hall.

On Monday – Wednesday, all Session One and Two exams are core subjects and **all** students will be on site for those exams. After lunch, in session 3, are options subjects. **If** your child does **not** study that subject, they will be dismissed from the end of session 3 in order to revise for the next day's exams.

On Thursday, there are options exams in both Session 2 and Session 3. Only when your child has completed **all** of their exams for the day, will they be dismissed. For example, if they do not study a language or Hospitality and Catering, they will remain on site for independent revision during session 2.

Art students will be taking their Art exam on the Friday before Assessment week on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June and this will run in T214 for the whole day.

11.00am-11.15am: **Registration for Session Two**

11.15am-12.45pm: **Session Two**

1.15pm-1.30pm: **Registration for Session Three**

1.30pm-3.00pm: **Session Three**

3.00pm: **DISMISSAL**

Please see the examination timetable for your child overleaf. Please do note that on **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June, school will finish at the end of session 2** with an extended break time for all students to receive lunch. This will mean **all** students who are on site will be dismissed either at the end of session one or session two at 2pm, depending on their options choices.

These assessments will be used to assess whether your child is making expected progress and are an important opportunity to show what they have learned in their subject areas. Please do support your child with organising their revision to give them the greatest chance of success in these assessments. All subjects will be providing topic lists after the half term to support with these assessments and these should be used at home and in prep to ensure students are fully prepared.
