An interview with...

Do you read regularly?

I do, mainly on the train to and from school. I particularly like non-fiction: I read lot of it at university, and still feel drawn to it.

What was the first book you really enjoyed?

One of my A Level English literature set texts was *Frankenstein* by Mary Shelley, which really fired my imagination. It has so many themes - life and death, the relationship between nature and science – it gave me a lot to think about. When I was much younger, I loved Winnie the Pooh and Roald Dahl – *The Twits* is an absolute classic.

What would you say to people who don't like reading?

Being smart is not something you *are*, it's something you *become* – like being strong. We all start from different starting points. Reading is a key way of helping you to get smarter over time. Also, reading is a great thing to do for your mental wellbeing. It's good for your mind and soul.

What are you reading at the moment?

Alastair Campbell used to work in the Government, and now hosts a podcast called *The Rest Is Politics*. I'm reading his book, *Winners: And How They Succed,* which profiles people from sports, politics, music, and many other fields. The book highlights that real success is simply about working really hard every single day and getting just 1% better as often as you can.
