SUMMER ASSESSMENT WEEK: 22nd – 26th JUNE 2026 (Year 10)

From Monday 22nd June, all students will be following a bespoke timetable for their Summer Assessments (AP2). The school day will start at the usual time of 8.35am with students expected to arrive at 8.30am. Rather than attending lessons, the day is then divided into three 1.5 hour slots during which students will either complete exams in the Sports Hall as they will at GCSE or participate in masterclasses in core subjects. The final session finishes as usual at 3pm and students will be dismissed from their final exam of the day at this time.

Please see the **final** examination timetable for your child overleaf. Due to staff absence, the Music Exam has been deferred until after AP2. All French and Spanish students will sit the same paper for this exam series and there is an additional Drama coursework session for GCSE students on Wednesday Session 1. The practical exams for Art and 3D Design in addition to the Drama coursework day has also now been confirmed for Monday 29th June for GCSE students.

Please do note that on **Friday 26th June, school will finish at the end of session 2** with an extended break time for all students to receive lunch. This will mean students who are on site will be dismissed at 1pm.

These assessments will be used to assess whether your child is making expected progress in line with expectation and are an important opportunity to show what they have learned in their subject areas. Please do support your child with organising their revision to give them the greatest chance of success in these assessments. All subjects provided topic lists after the half term to support with these assessments and these should be used at home and in prep to ensure students are fully prepared.
